**FORMER PRISONERS OF WAR HONORED**  
***Lebanon VA Medical Center Recognizes the Service and Sacrifice of Former POWs***

LEBANON – September 18, 2013 –

On Friday, September 20, the Lebanon VA Medical Center will host a ceremony to honor the service and sacrifices of former American Prisoners of War (POWs) and to honor those who remain Missing in Action (MIA). The ceremony will take place at the Holiday Inn Harrisburg-Hershey (Grantville) at 11:00 a.m. The guest speaker this year is Air Force Veteran and retired WGAL newscaster Dick Hoxworth.

American POWs often endured extreme hardship during their captivity. More than 17,000 died in captivity. Those who did, are remembered by those who survived, as well as, their loved ones. Approximately 130,000 US personnel were POWs in World War II; 7,200 in the Korean War, 725 during the Vietnam War; and 47 American personnel were POWs during the Gulf War. The Department of Defense also estimates that more than 83,000 Americans remain MIA from World War II, the Korean War, the Cold War, the Vietnam War and the 1991 Gulf War.
